Driving and Parking through the Village

I have recently received further specific reports from concerned parents regarding the driving and parking of vehicles at the start and end of the school day. We all want our children to arrive safely at school. Parking is difficult so allow ample time to bring children into school for 8.45am and **please watch your speed as your drive through the village.**

Please can we remind you about the following issues involved with the amount of traffic in the village and ask you to work with us:

- Parking further along Church Street away from the school will help alleviate congestion by the Nursery and avoid potential accidents. Be aware of leaving sufficient access to residents' driveways and 'keep clear' markings near farm entrances.
- Car-sharing with other families, even just once a week to help reduce the number of vehicles.
- <u>Do not park on the pavement</u> as this restricts access for pedestrians and makes it very difficult to cross the road due to reduced vision up and down the street. This is particularly dangerous for the younger children walking to school who cannot be seen by drivers' due to the parked cars. **Pedestrians please supervise your children carefully and be aware of**

moving vehicles. Drivers please be aware of surface water when driving and parking adjacent to the Nursery and be considerate to pedestrians walking into school.

 <u>Do not use the green area in front of the school</u> for dropping off, picking up or parking as this is the school's main access for emergency services. The safety of our children is paramount. Only designated taxis and mini buses are permitted to use area. This is also a private road.

These initiatives will only work if we <u>all</u> try to change our habits and consider the needs of others. Thank you.
