Dear Shellingford School Family,

Welcome back to Spring Term Four. We hope that you and your family have managed to have a restful and enjoyable half-term break. We are also hoping that you have spent the night sleeping on the floor to raise money for the charity 'February on the Floor!' The online sponsorship link will close on Sunday 5th March and we look forward to letting you know what we have raised.



The **Sculpture Workshop** planned for this week has unfortunately had to be rescheduled and will now take place later on this term (see diary dates below), so we will look forward to this event in due course.

World Book Day is next week on Thursday 2^{nd} March and we are encouraging children to dress-up, or decorate a vegetable as a book character, and to bring in a favourite book to share. Throughout the week we will be focusing on reading for pleasure with different classroom activities running throughout each day for the children. One of the activities we are planning is 'The Masked Reader' which will involve our 'Reading Ambassadors' reading a short section from a favourite book through a filter which adds a different face and voice. The children then guess who they think is reading the book and will be 'unmasked' at the end of the week. Schools across the country have also once again been given £1.00 Book Tokens to distribute to children. These book tokens can be swapped completely free for one of the World Book Day books or used to get £1.00 off any full price book. Tokens are valid up until Sunday 26^{th} March.

Annual Parent Questionnaire

At this time in the school year, we often send out a questionnaire and we would like to hear your current views. We are constantly seeking to improve the school and your feedback is very important to us. Reminders - we would also appreciate your help and support with the following:

School Uniform

We quite often receive comments from visitors on how smart the children look, and we would like to thank you for ensuring the children arrive at school looking clean, tidy and wearing the correct uniform! However, we have noticed recently that some items are being worn which are not part of our school Uniform Policy. Please can I remind you that friendship bracelets, wristbands, necklaces, boots or trainers are not to be worn at school and socks and hair accessories need to be either grey, black, blue or white in colour. Long hair also needs to be tied back.

Notification of After-School Collection Arrangements

We ask all parents to notify Mrs Ashdown in the School Office by 1.00pm, ideally via email, of any change in person who will be collecting your child/ren at the end of the school day (unless in an event of an emergency).

Packed Lunches

Children opting for packed lunches are encouraged to bring in a 'healthy, balanced lunch'. Please note that sweets, chocolate are not allowed, and crisps and biscuits are discouraged.

We have pupils in the school who have potentially life-threatening allergy to nuts and peanuts. For this reason, it is school policy that all snacks and all packed lunches DO NOT contain foods with nuts or nut ingredients e.g. Cereal bars. Thank you.

Driving and Parking through the Village

We all want our children to arrive safely at school. Parking is difficult so allow ample time to bring children into school for 8.45am and **please watch your speed as your drive through the village.**

Please can we remind you about the following issues involved with the amount of traffic in the village and ask you to work with us:

- Parking further along Church Street away from the school will help alleviate congestion by the Nursery and avoid potential accidents. Be aware of leaving sufficient access to residents' driveways and 'keep clear' markings near farm entrances.
- o Car-sharing with other families, even just once a week to help reduce the number of vehicles.
- On not park on the pavement as this restricts access for pedestrians and makes it very difficult to cross the road due to reduced vision up and down the street. This is particularly dangerous for the younger children walking to school who cannot be seen by drivers' due to the parked cars. Pedestrians please supervise your children carefully and be aware of moving vehicles.
- Do not use the green area in front of the school for dropping off, picking up or parking as this is the school's main access for emergency services. The safety of our children is paramount. Only designated taxis and mini-buses are permitted to use area. This is also a private road.

These initiatives will only work if we <u>all</u> try to change our habits and consider the needs of others. Thank you.
