WORLD BOOK DAY is next week on Thursday 6th March and we are inviting the children to dress up and wear a costume that reflects a character from a book or story they particularly enjoy. GIFTS TO STAFF

Following a recent audit from Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) all schools are required to adopt a Gifts and Hospitality Policy to ensure compliance with OCC policies and procedures going forward. Under this policy, generally gifts of nominal value to staff or governors such as small tokens of appreciation may be accepted, but if they are valued at over £50, they must be recorded on a Gifts and Hospitality Register.

Any monetary gifts, including gift vouchers of any amount, must be declined by staff or governors.

Staff have daily commitments and meetings after school which they need to attend.
