# PARENTS OPEN MORNING 'CONNECTION OR COINCIDENCE' - WEDNESDAY 19<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER

As part of Maths Week England (Monday  $17^{th}$  - Friday  $21^{st}$  November) we are <u>inviting parents to come into classes between 9.00 - 9.30am on Wednesday  $19^{th}$  November to experience Maths learning in action! This year's theme of 'Connection and Coincidence' is about mathematical relationships and looking at patterns and puzzles with children. We hope that this will give you a taster of the kind of activities and games you could do to support your children at home.</u>

### **AUTUMN/WINTER SCHOOL UNIFORM REMINDERS**

As the weather becomes wetter and colder, we require all children to have the appropriate outdoor winter clothing in school daily:

- A waterproof and windproof coat
- A warm hat, scarf and gloves
- A pair of wellington boots. \*Please note children are only allowed on the field in wellies.
- A PE Kit. \*Black or navy tracksuit trousers for colder days are useful and a spare pair of socks as most PE lessons take place outside. (A plastic bag for muddy trainers is also a good idea!) Please note for health and safety reasons, watches and earrings are not to be worn for PE and long hair must be tied back. Please provide a small box or envelope for your child to take out their own earrings or tape for us to cover them, as well as hair ties if this applies to your child.

**Forest School sessions**: Children also need waterproofs, wellies, and old clothes.

<u>Please check all clothing and footwear are clearly named to ensure any lost items can be returned.</u> If items are not bought into school a reminder letter will be sent home to parents. Thank you.

### **HEALTHY SNACKS**

As part of our Food and Healthy Eating Policy we encourage children to pursue a healthy and balanced diet. Children in Foundation and Key Stage One receive a free piece of fruit or vegetable every school day at break-time through the School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme administered by the Department of Health. At lunchtimes our school meals provided by OCC comply with nutritional standards. Children opting for homemade packed lunches are also encouraged to bring in a healthy, balanced lunch. Sweets and chocolate are not allowed in packed lunches and crisps and biscuits are discouraged. Thank you.
